Dear Congressman Cunningham:

One of San Diego's key transportation infrastructure projects that would greatly benefit from your continued support is the completion of the missing State Route 56 (SR-56)/Interstate 5 (I-5) freeway connectors in Carmel Valley. This transportation infrastructure is critical to improving traffic flow in the Carmel Valley region, and is especially important to those of us who operate businesses and live in this community.

Once completed, SR-56 will create an invaluable link between Interstates 5 and 15; anyone that has tried to drive across Mira Mesa Boulevard during rush hour knows this. However, motorists traveling west on SR-56 will be forced to use local roads in Carmel Valley to access I-5 North, and motorists exiting I-5 south will be forced to use those same local roads to access SR-56 East. I would encourage you to visit the existing interchange the next time you are in San Diego. You'll see that the exchange is poorly planned and will only result in nightmare traffic snarls.

Failure to secure funding and complete this project also will affect San Diego's housing shortage. There are approximately 6,500 housing units slated for construction in the communities adjacent to the SR-56, including more than 1,000 affordable homes. However, development of these homes will be delayed until the connectors are completed, dramatically at a time when the demand for new housing continues to increase at an unprecedented pace.

Securing funding for the completion of the SR-56/I-5 connectors is a top priority among local business leaders. I encourage your continued efforts to secure funds for the missing SR-56 connectors and thank you for all the good work you have done and are continuing to do in Washington. As your election results have shown again and again, the citizens of San Diego are very happy with the quality of your representation and I am no exception.
