Dear Congressman Cunningham:

As a Sorrento-Valley based company with 140 employees who commute each day, we strongly urge your support of the funding needed for the two missing SR-56 freeway connectors. This transportation infrastructure is critical to improving traffic flow in the region, and is especially important to those of us who operate businesses and live in Sorrento Valley where traffic congestion is an ongoing issue.

Once completed, SR-56 will create an invaluable link between Interstates 5 and 15. However, motorists traveling west on SR-56 will be forced to use local roads in Carmel Valley to access I-5 North, and motorists exiting I-5 south will be forced to use those same local roads to access SR-56 East. This will result in congestive surface traffic, potential increases in traffic delays due to accidents, and additional wear-and-tear to local roads from increased traffic volume.

Failure to secure funding and complete this project also will affect San Diego's housing shortage. There are approximately 6,500 housing units slated for construction in the communities adjacent to the SR-56, including more than 1,000 affordable homes. However, development of these homes will be delayed until the connectors are completed, dramatically at a time when the demand for new housing continues to increase at an unprecedented pace.

Securing funding for the completion of the SR-56/I-5 connectors is a top priority among local business leaders. I encourage your continued efforts to secure funds for the missing SR-56 connectors.
